

Tokyo University of Agriculture Graduate Schools Scholarship scheme (Tokyo NODAI Graduate Schools Scholarship)

1. Tokyo NODAI Graduate Schools Scholarship Recipients
 - Category 1 scholarships are for all applicable master's program and doctoral program students (exemption of half of tuition and facility and equipment fee).
 - Category 2 scholarship recipients are all Tokyo NODAI graduates (exemption of entrance fee JPY 270,000).
 - Category 3 scholarships apply to master's program international students in all majors (up to half of the admission quota for each major).
 - *This is for those who graduated the undergraduate program of Tokyo NODAI (enrolled for more than four years), or who graduated from a global partner university of Tokyo NODAI, among the successful students of the entrance exam to Master's Program.
2. "Find Ignorance After Learning" Scholarship. * Doctoral Program only.
All applicable doctoral program students who finished an undergraduate course and master's program at Tokyo NODAI are eligible (exemption of the entrance fee, tuition, and facility and equipment fee).

What is the "Find Ignorance After Learning" Scholarship?

Viscount Enomoto Takeaki, the founder of Tokyo NODAI, was a scientist who learned the advanced technology of his day in Europe and a cosmopolitan figure with a pioneering spirit. In 1891, the year of the founding of the Ikueiko School of the Tokugawa Ikuei-kai Foundation, Viscount Enomoto, who was 56 at the time, made a calligraphic copy of the phrase "Find ignorance after learning," from the Chinese classic the *Book of Rites*, and expounded on the importance of learning. Inheriting this spirit from Viscount Enomoto, the university established a scheme to provide scholarships to students in order to **cultivate successors to the eminent instructors and researchers who are the pillars of the university's "practical science" education and research, in commemoration of its 125th anniversary**, and named the scholarship after Viscount Enomoto's calligraphy.

Scholarship Eligibility Screening

Even students who receive a scholarship at the time of matriculation may lose eligibility depending on the results of an eligibility screening (to check outcomes and attitudes toward learning, research, and important activities) conducted at the end of each academic year. Persons who withdraw from the school also lose eligibility.
